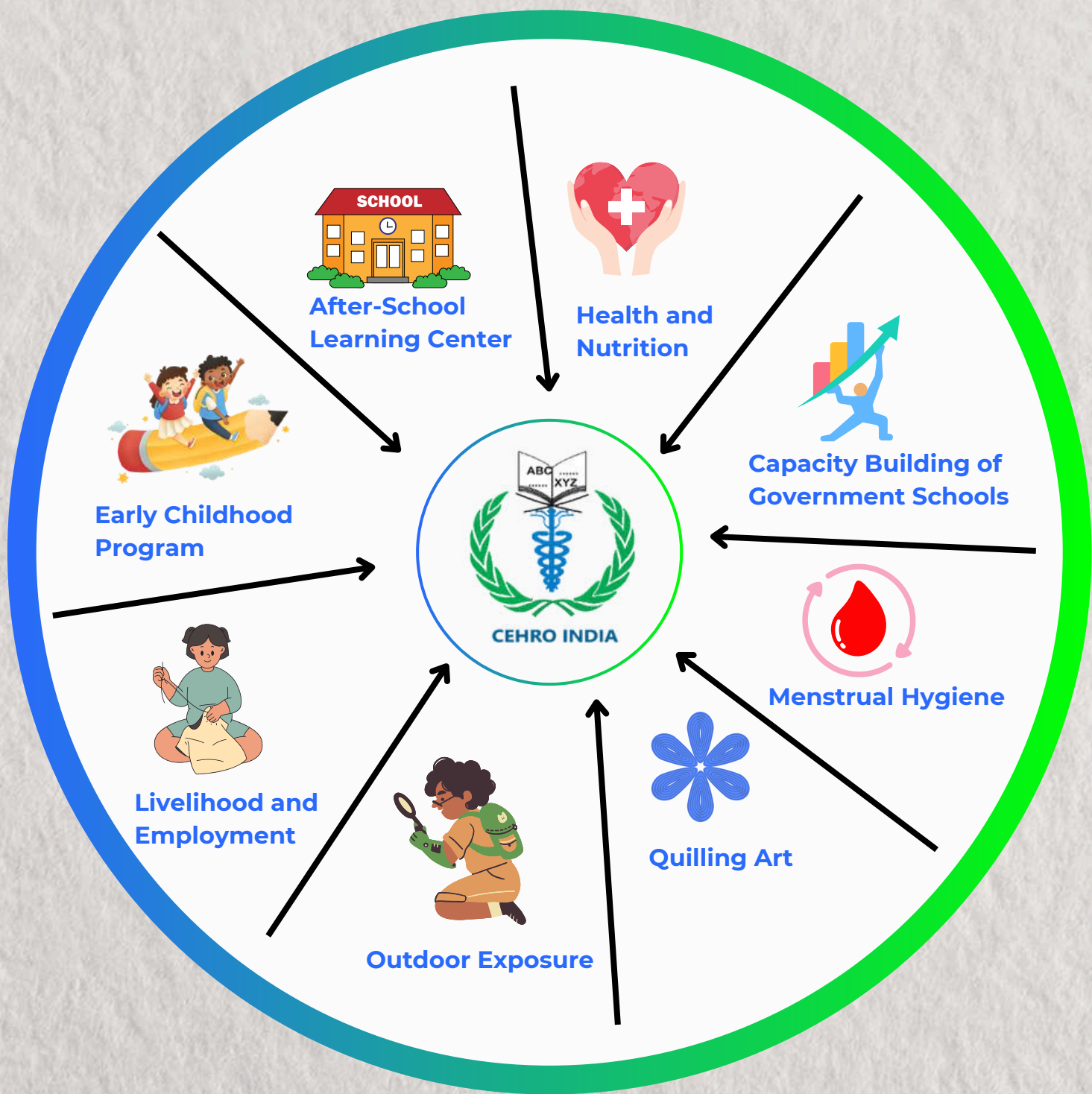
CEHRO INDIA

Centre for Education and Health Research Organization (CEHRO INDIA) is a philanthropic organization registered under the 1860 Societies Act, dedicated to assisting the underprivileged and neglected sections of society in realizing their dreams of living a respectful and dignified life by addressing their basic needs of education, health, and employment. On 12th March 2012, we started the organization with 50 underprivileged children. To date, we have impacted over 11,576 children.

Currently, we are working in Delhi, Haryana, and Uttar Pradesh, serving predominantly migrant families with an annual income of less than 1 lakh. Around 45% of our children come from critically poor families, and approximately 70% of them are girl students. We primarily serve first-generation learners, who are often deprived of basic necessities.

Our mission revolves around ensuring that no child should drop out and that every child enjoys schooling and childhood. We emphasize employment through skill development, aiming to break the cycle of poverty.

We aspire for children not to choose traditional occupations such as rag picking or labor, surpassing their parents to achieve a better future. Our holistic support helps these underprivileged children to break barriers and thrive.



VISION

CEHRO INDIA aims to provide access to education and a healthy environment for the holistic development of children whose parents work as rag pickers, sanitation workers, and daily wage labourers.

MISSION

By 2050, every migrant poverty-affected child in Munirka and nearby slums will be given an inclusive, supportive, and progressive environment so that she/he can grow to their full potential.

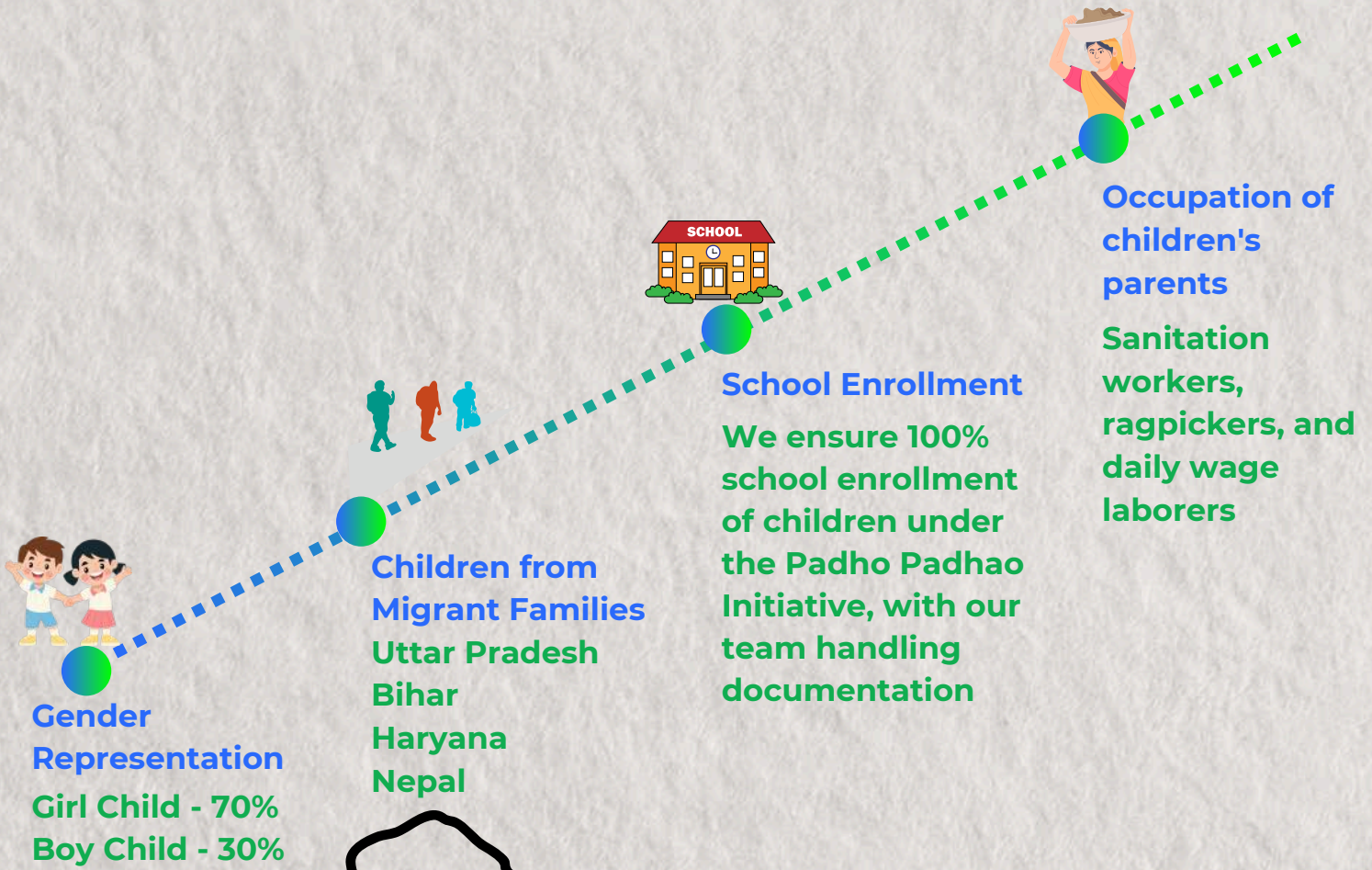


About Padho Padhao Initiative

The Padho-Padhao Initiative aims to bridge the learning gap between what a child currently knows and what they are expected to know at their age. We focus primarily on literacy and numeracy, where many children face significant challenges. When combined with socio-economic barriers, these gaps can have long-term negative consequences.

To address this, we conduct after-school support classes in Hindi, English, and Mathematics. Our approach is child-centric and activity-based, developed through thorough research by our team. As a result, children supported by our program often reach their appropriate grade level within 2-3 years.

For younger children aged 4-6, we run early learning programs designed to prepare them for formal schooling. We use custom-designed Teaching Learning Material (TLM) and a curriculum that matches their developmental needs. Through playful and engaging activities like phonics, poem recitation, and motor skill development, children become familiar with the school environment. This early exposure not only builds their foundational skills but also boosts their confidence and eagerness to attend school regularly.



Impact at a Glance

- 2,000 children empowered through Padho Padhao.
- 364 women trained under the Sui Dhaaga Initiative.
- 24,375 children supported in 45 schools under Padhai Likhai Abhiyan.
- 122 workshops were conducted for children and women.
- 28,574 children screened; 7158 received eyeglasses.
- 89 children enrolled in school.



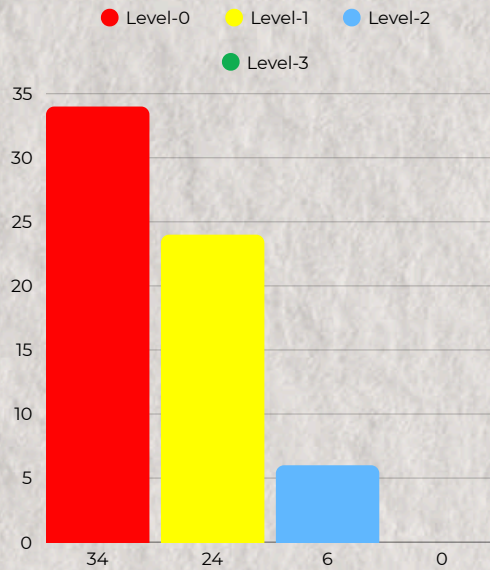
Year at Glance

Summer Camp Learning Program

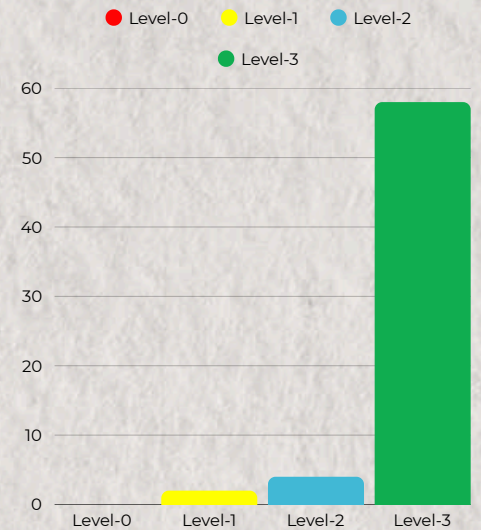
This year, under our Padho Padhao Initiative, CEHRO INDIA targeted 64 children who required additional academic support through a structured summer learning program focused on strengthening foundational literacy and language skills for Munirka Centre.

Program Highlights

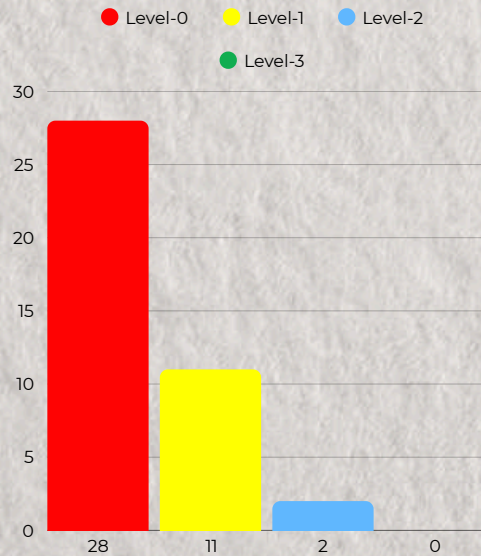
- 18 peer mentors actively supported their fellow learners through a peer-to-peer learning model, fostering collaboration, comprehension, and confidence.
- 100% of students enrolled showed significant improvement in their ability to read and understand both English and Hindi, a milestone for many first-generation learners.
- Children were grouped based on individual assessments into: Level 0, Level 1, Level 2, Level 3
- A total of 4 facilitators conducted classes across multiple sessions throughout the summer break, using customized TLM (Teaching-Learning Materials) designed for each level.
- Along with academic sessions, music classes, and outdoor activities were integrated to ensure holistic development and joy in learning.
- Teacher Planning Meetings were held to design level-wise learning strategies and teaching materials.
- Parent-Teacher Meetings were conducted before the start of the program to encourage consistent attendance and home support.
- A total of 37 children participated in the program aimed at strengthening basic math and foundational numeracy skills



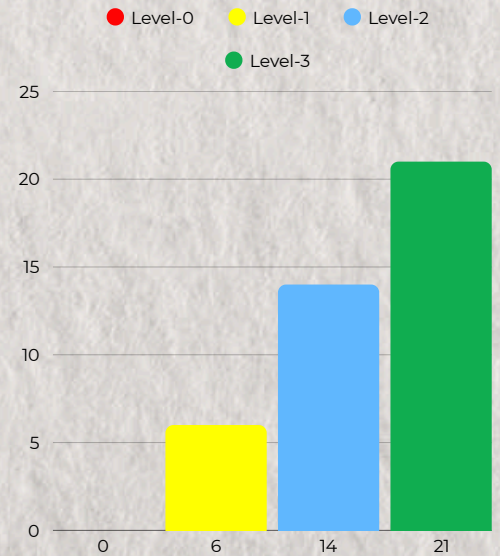
Hindi reading and writing level before summer camp.

The data provided above is based on the baseline assessment conducted by Team CEHRO INDIA before the start of the summer camp. Out of 315 children, 64 were at Level 0, which means the child is unable to read and write in Hindi and English. Level 1 indicates that the child can understand words and tries to read simple words by combining them. Level 2 means the child is able to read simple storybooks in Hindi and English. Level 3 indicates that the child can read and understand Hindi and English fluently.

Impact Highlights



Abhilasha's Journey: A Story of Hope and Determination

Abhilasha's family migrated from Bihar to Delhi in search of a better future. She has three siblings, and her father works as a plumber to support the family. When they arrived in Delhi last year, Abhilasha faced a major challenge — she was unable to secure admission in a school due to the lack of proper documents.

Determined to continue her education, she and her mother approached our NGO office for help. Understanding the urgency of the situation, our team worked closely with them and successfully facilitated her admission into a girls' school in R.K. Puram, Sector 4. When she first joined us, she struggled to read basic Hindi and English and faced difficulty keeping up in school.

Through daily extra classes and dedicated support provided during the summer camp, Abhilasha made remarkable progress. She not only learned to read but also became fluent in Hindi reading and significantly improved her English reading and understanding skills.

Today, she stands as a shining example of how timely support and the right opportunities can transform a child's future.



Virat – Class 4

When Virat first joined our centre, he could barely recognize letters in Hindi or English. Coming from a humble background where his father works as a housekeeping staff and his mother takes care of infants as a baby care worker, Virat's exposure to reading and writing was very limited. But what he lacked in resources, he made up for with incredible curiosity. Over time, with consistent support and his own determination, Virat began to recognize words, form sentences, and now, he reads and writes both Hindi and English with fluency. His confidence has grown, and so has his dream—to one day become a teacher and help children like himself.



Ananya – Class 5

Ananya's story is one of resilience and quiet strength. Her mother works as a maid, and her father is a driver, both working long hours to make ends meet. When she joined our centre, Ananya struggled with the basics of reading and writing in both Hindi and English. But she showed up every day with a spark in her eyes. She listened carefully, practiced endlessly, and never hesitated to ask questions. Today, she reads stories aloud with joy and pens her thoughts beautifully in both languages. Her journey is a reminder that with the right guidance and a nurturing environment, every child can shine.



Ishita – Class 5

After losing her father to a tragic accident during the COVID-19 pandemic, Ishita's world turned upside down. Her mother, who works as a maid, has been the sole pillar of strength in their family. When Ishita joined us, she was withdrawn and struggled with basic literacy. But slowly, through encouragement, personalized attention, and a safe space to grow, she began to open up. Today, she is not only fluent in reading and writing Hindi and English but also expresses herself through beautiful poems and stories. Ishita's journey is a testament to healing through education and hope.



Sadiya – Class 6

Sadiya's parents work tirelessly—her mother as a sanitation worker and her father in a hotel. With limited time and resources, Sadiya had little access to academic help at home. When she joined our centre, she was shy and hesitant, especially when asked to read aloud or write. But over time, she began to embrace learning with enthusiasm. Today, she reads fluently and writes confidently in both Hindi and English. She loves helping her peers and often volunteers to read stories during sessions. Sadiya's transformation reflects the powerful impact of consistent mentorship and a space where children are encouraged to believe in themselves.



Outdoor Workshops

Art Workshops at Kiran Nadar Museum of art

As part of the Padho Padhao Initiative, we conducted 116 outdoor art workshops this year in collaboration with the Kiran Nadar Museum of Art and other cultural institutions. These workshops brought learning beyond the classroom, making it accessible, creative, and exciting for children from slum communities.

Program Highlights

- Workshops were conducted at Saket Mall, and the participating children were from five slums across South West Delhi.
- Collaborated with Kiran Nadar Museum of Art and other key partners to bring professional art experiences to grassroots settings.
- Reached children across all age groups, especially those with limited access to creative education.
- Sessions blended art history, hands-on creation, storytelling, and performances, introducing students to both classical and contemporary forms.
- Encouraged peer learning, open dialogue, and team-based creativity to boost social skills and communication.
- Achieved a 96% attendance rate at our center, reflecting regular participation following these art sessions.



Outdoor Exposure through Corporate Immersion

This year, children had significant outdoor and real-life experiences through employee engagement programs with TCNS and Azure Power. At TCNS Clothing Company Limited, children celebrated Christmas with the employees, who generously sent wonderful gifts to mark the occasion. The children were thrilled to receive their gifts, and they also had the opportunity to engage with the employees at TCNS's Chattarpur office, creating lasting memories of joy and connection.

On the other hand, children celebrated Diwali with Azure Power at their Gurugram office, where they engaged with employees and showcased their quilling arts and crafts, which were highly appreciated. In addition to the enriching experience, the children received thoughtful Diwali gifts, further making the celebration special.





Holistic Support to Child

Annual Winter Drive 2024

Through our Annual Winter Drive Campaign ensured that thousands of underprivileged children stayed warm, confident, and school-ready during the harsh winter season. A total of 389 children received brand-new winter clothing, while 500 children received new sports shoes, enabling them to attend school with comfort and dignity.

Program Highlights

- Boosted self-esteem and motivation among students, enabling them to participate confidently in school activities.
- We ran the Chhoti Si Asha Winter Campaign to support underprivileged children by providing them with essential warm clothing and comfort during the cold season.
- This impactful campaign was made possible through the generous contribution of QVT, whose continued commitment to children's welfare enabled us to reach thousands in need.





Public Speaking Modules

10 Weeks Program for the Age group of children 11-13

This year, CEHRO INDIA introduced a 10-week structured public speaking program under the PadhoPadhao Initiative, designed to help children aged 11 to 13 years become confident communicators and emerging leaders. Rooted in the belief that every child has a voice worth hearing, the initiative focused on building practical speaking and presentation skills that extend far beyond the classroom.

Program Highlights

- 10-week structured curriculum led by professional public speaking coaches and trainers.
- Focused modules on speech structuring, content delivery, and voice modulation.
- Implemented a learn-by-doing approach, prioritizing practice over theory.
- Encouraged children to overcome stage fright and speak confidently in front of peers.
- Improved critical thinking, self-expression, and articulation skills.
- Children began participating more actively in school events and competitions.
- Teachers observed notable improvements in student communication and engagement.

Impact Highlights



We take great pride in celebrating the achievements of our students, whose dedication and determination continue to inspire. Their recent successes in academics, sports, and public speaking serve as powerful reminders of the boundless potential within each child when provided with the right support and guidance.

This year, several students were awarded certificates and trophies for their exceptional performance, not only at the school level but also at zonal and district levels. These accolades have not only brought personal pride to the students but have also served as a source of motivation for their peers to excel in their respective areas of interest.

A special mention goes to Sachin and Bharti, who demonstrated outstanding skills in public speaking. Both secured first place at the zonal level, with Sachin also earning second place and Bharti third place at the district level.

Their confidence, clarity, and passion for the art of speaking have set a remarkable example for others to follow, making CEHRO INDIA incredibly proud.

Padhayee Likhayee is a transformative initiative committed to strengthening the government schooling system by addressing key gaps in infrastructure and resources. The program focuses on creating inclusive learning environments by ensuring students have access to essential amenities that support their academic growth. By bridging disparities in government schools and partnering with organizations to enhance the quality of education, Padhayee Likhayee empowers underserved children with the tools they need to succeed academically and thrive in their educational journey.

Basic Resource Distribution

CEHRO INDIA, in collaboration with the Greensole Foundation, successfully reached 24,375 children across 45 government school in Delhi, Haryana, and Uttar Pradesh, providing essential educational kits to students in need.

By visiting schools that required basic infrastructure support, our team distributed brand-new school bags, slippers, and mats—resources that, while simple, play a crucial role in helping children feel prepared, valued, and motivated to attend school regularly.

This initiative goes beyond just providing materials—it's about ensuring equal opportunities, enhancing classroom participation, and making sure children aren't held back due to a lack of basic resources.

Each distribution brought joy and dignity, and the excitement on the children's faces showed the positive impact of receiving even the simplest support. These essentials help ease their journey to and from school, provide comfort in class, and inspire continued commitment to their education.

- Distributed school bags, slippers, and mats to enhance comfort and classroom readiness
- Promoted school attendance, dignity, and engagement in education
- Partnered with the Greensole Foundation, providing upcycled, sustainable products
- Aligned with Sustainable Development Goals—especially Quality Education and Sustainability
- Created a visible and emotional impact, boosting confidence and joy among children
- Reinforced CEHRO INDIA's commitment to equity and holistic educational support





Pediatric Eye Check-ups for Kids

At CEHRO India, we believe that every child deserves the chance to see the world clearly and pursue their dreams without barriers. In partnership with the Lenskart Foundation, our Pediatric Eye Checkup Program has taken a crucial step toward making this belief a reality. Through this initiative, we conducted free eye screenings for 28,574 children across 14 government schools and 18 communities/slums in New Delhi.

Children identified with vision challenges were provided with free prescription glasses, removing a significant barrier to learning and development. This effort is not just about health; it's about empowering children to engage fully in the classroom, improve their academic performance, and boost their confidence.

For many, this was the first time they received proper eye care, and the ability to clearly see the blackboard, read books, and participate in daily activities proved to be a transformative experience. By providing eye care to thousands of children who otherwise could not afford it, we are ensuring that something as fundamental as clear vision will not limit a child's potential. Through this collaboration with the Lenskart Foundation, we are helping children.

Program Key Highlights

- CEHRO India, in partnership with the Lenskart Foundation, launched the Pediatric Eye Checkup Program to support children's vision and learning.

- 7158 children identified with vision challenges were provided with free prescription eyeglasses.
- For many children, this was their first access to proper eye care.
- Clear vision has helped children better read books, see the blackboard, and participate actively in class.
- The program has significantly contributed to improved academic performance, enhanced confidence, and holistic development.
- By addressing a critical health need, the initiative ensures that no child's education is limited by poor vision.





Sui Dhaaga Initiative

This year, 364 women proudly received their certificates through the Sui Dhaaga Initiative, marking a significant milestone in their journey toward financial independence. The training program was designed to equip them with essential tailoring skills and techniques, enabling them to sew clothes and earn a livelihood for themselves and their families.

By providing sewing machines to the participants, CEHRO INDIA ensured that they had the tools to start their own ventures, creating opportunities for self-sustainability. This initiative not only enhances their skills but also strengthens their sense of self-reliance, contributing to the overall well-being of their families and communities.

Key Highlights

- 886 women trained since 2021 under the Sui Dhaaga Initiative.
- The tailoring course is designed to enhance skills and performance.
- Sewing machines were provided to participants to enable them to earn a livelihood.
- Aprox. 70% of the women started earning after completing the course.
- Empowerment of women through self-reliance and financial independence.



Madhu's Journey: From Learner to Leader

Madhu, a determined and hardworking woman from Bijnor, Rajasthan, embarked on a life-changing journey in 2023. Like many women from underserved communities, she dreamed of becoming financially independent but lacked formal skills or training. With hope in her heart, she enrolled in our stitching program, determined to create a better future for herself.

Over the course of 4 months, Madhu dedicated herself wholeheartedly to learning the art of stitching. From understanding the basics to mastering more intricate designs, she showed remarkable growth and passion. Her commitment did not go unnoticed. After completing her training, she was provided with a sewing machine, which helped her take the first step toward her entrepreneurial journey.

Madhu began stitching clothes from home, gradually building trust and a loyal customer base within her community. With every stitch, her skills improved, and so did her confidence. Her earnings, though modest at first, gave her a deep sense of independence and pride.

Today, Madhu is not just financially independent. She is also giving back. After completing her course with us, she is now working as a trainer with a local NGO in Rajasthan. In this role, she continues to empower other women by sharing her knowledge and inspiring them to pursue their own paths to self-reliance.

Madhu's journey from a learner to a leader is a shining example of how skill development, opportunity, and encouragement can spark real and lasting change.

Meena's Story: From Struggles to Self-Reliance



Meena's journey is a powerful example of strength, courage, and new beginnings. Living in Delhi with her young child, Meena has been facing life's challenges with determination over the past three years, while her husband continues to live in another place for work-related reasons. Managing the household responsibilities and taking care of her child single-handedly was never easy, especially without a steady source of income.

Previously, Meena worked as a domestic helper in a household, earning just enough to meet her daily needs. However, her situation took a difficult turn when the family she worked for relocated, leaving her without a job. With no work opportunities at hand and growing responsibilities towards her child's upbringing and education, Meena was deeply worried about the future.

Refusing to give up, Meena sought new ways to support herself and her family. She came to know about our Sui Dhaaga Initiative, a program designed to empower women by teaching them stitching and tailoring skills. Eager to learn, Meena enrolled in the training and dedicated herself fully to mastering the craft. Over a period of 4 months, through hard work, practice, and encouragement from the trainers, she developed strong skills in stitching and tailoring.

After successfully completing her training, Meena took a step towards self-reliance by inaugurating her own boutique. This new venture became a turning point in her life. Today, Meena has a steady source of income and is able to provide better support for her child's needs, education, and overall well-being. She is no longer dependent on others for her livelihood and has gained a new sense of confidence and pride.

Meena's story is a true reflection of how access to skill-building opportunities and timely support can transform lives. Her journey reminds us that with the right guidance and determination, anyone can rise above their challenges and build a brighter, more secure future.



Outdoor workshops for women

At CEHRO INDIA, we believe empowerment goes beyond skill-building. Our outdoor workshops offer women a chance to step outside their routines, explore new ideas, and build confidence. These experiences have helped many women gain self-belief, express themselves freely, and connect with others. With every workshop, we see stronger, more inspired individuals ready to take charge of their growth and contribute actively to their communities.

Key Highlights

- This year, we conducted 6 outdoor workshops, with 237 women actively participating across all centers.
- Helped women step out of their comfort zones and gain exposure to new environments.
- Boosted confidence and encouraged self-expression through creative and group activities.
- Fostered a sense of community and peer support among women from diverse backgrounds.
- Inspired women to participate more actively in local programs and take initiative in their personal growth.



Menstrual Hygiene Awareness Program

CEHRO India has remained dedicated to raising awareness about menstrual health and hygiene, to break the silence surrounding menstruation. Through our sessions held at locations including Inder Camp, Shankar Camp, and Sankar Camp, we have been able to educate women and girls on the importance of proper menstrual hygiene practices. These sessions have led to significant impacts, including increased awareness, empowerment of women by reducing stigma, improved health practices, better access to menstrual hygiene resources, and the creation of a supportive community environment.

In addition, our annual celebration of Menstrual Hygiene Awareness Month in May, along with the distribution of sanitary napkins, continues to enhance menstrual health for underprivileged communities in South West Delhi. Through partnerships with organizations like Sofy (Unicharm India), CEHRO India is working toward building a healthier, more informed, and empowered community.

Key Highlights

- This year, our efforts reached 5,000 girls.
- Increased awareness about menstrual hygiene practices among women and girls.
- Empowered 700+ girls & women by reducing stigma and boosting confidence in managing menstrual health.
- Promoted safer health practices to prevent infections.

- Distributed sanitary napkins to underprivileged girls and women across 5 slums in South West Delhi.
- Collaborated with Sofy (Unicharm India) for the menstrual hygiene session.
- Distributed sanitary napkins at the Nepali Camp to enhance menstrual well-being.
